3. Brian thinks of his English teacher Mr. Perpich in chapter 5. Why do you think he think Mr. Perpich comes to his mind? What was Mr. Perpich's best piece of for Brian right now?
4. After looking into the calm water and seeing his reflection Brian slaps the water with his hand in chapter 7. Why does he do this?
5. Who is Brian's "hungry" friend? Use evidence from the text to support your inference.
6. How does the author make the audience aware of Brian's appreciation for the new food? Use examples from the text in chapter 15.
7. The author uses great descriptive language to describe the beautiful surroundings that Brian is in chapter 17. What were some of the descriptions that helped the audience visualize his surroundings?
